OPEN SESSION

- 1. Approval of Minutes:** The Board minutes for January 21, 2009 were approved 3-0.
- 2. Public Comments:** Freddie Sanchez introduced Tim Hamann from UFCW, Local 5. Mr. Hamann expressed concern regarding the amount of time investigation of unfair labor practices may take. Mr. Sanchez requested information on the Collaborative Solutions Conference scheduled for March 18-20, 2009 in Anaheim.
- 3. Chairman Report:** Chairman Almaraz welcomed our guests. Chairman Almaraz briefed the Board on the January Labor and Workforce Development Agency (LWDA) management meeting. Jeff Wiley is the new Communications Director for LWDA. Chairman Almaraz and Member Rivera-Hernandez attended a breakfast for Latino appointees hosted by State and Consumer Services Secretary Rosario Marin.
- 4. General Counsel Report:** General Counsel Lee reported that regional staff continues to reduce the number of pending charges while at the same time investigating current charges.

ELECTION REPORT:

NOTICE OF INTENT TO TAKE ACCESS (NA) AND NOTICE OF INTENT TO ORGANIZE (NO):

On January 23, 2009 UFCW Local 5 filed a notice of intent to take access (2009-NA-003-VIS) and notice of intent to organize (2009-NO-002-VIS) at Frank Pinheiro Dairy and Milanesio Farms.

On January 26, 2009 Teamster Local 890 filed a notice of intent to take access (2009-NA-001-SAL) and notice of intent to organize at Kawahara Nurseries in the areas of Gilroy, Morgan Hills and San Lorenzo CA (2009-NO-001-SAL).

PENDING ELECTION MATTERS:

Gallo Vineyards, Inc., 07-RD-1-SAL

On June 18, Roberto Parra filed a decertification petition seeking to remove the United Farm Workers of America as the exclusive bargaining representative of Gallo's agricultural employees in Sonoma County. The petition lists the approximate number of employees in the unit as 400. The election was held on June 25, 2007 and yielded the following results:

On July 2, 2007 the UFW filed objections to the election. The objections were held in abeyance pending resolution of ULP's mirroring the election objections. On October 5, 2007 the Regional Director dismissed three of four overlapping charges (07-CE-23-SAL, 07-CE-25-SAL and 07-CE-26-SAL). On October 18, 2007, the UFW filed a request for review of the three charges. On November 16, 2008, the General Counsel affirmed the Regional Director's dismissal of the three charges. On February 5, 2008 the Salinas Regional Director and Employer reached an informal settlement agreement resolving the allegations of the remaining charge, 07-CE-24-SAL. The UFW filed a request for review of the agreement. The request for review was denied by the General Counsel on March 10, 2008. On June 6, 2008, the Executive Secretary issued his order on election objections in Gallo Vineyards, Inc., 07-RD-1-SAL setting one objection for hearing and dismissing the rest. The UFW filed a request for review of the partial dismissal. The Board's issued its decision on November 7, 2008 affirming the Executive Secretary's order dismissing the election objections. The UFW filed a motion for reconsideration of the Board's decision. The General Counsel intervened in the proceeding and filed a response to the motion. On January 7, 2009 the Board denied the UFW's motion for reconsideration. The hearing on the sole objection was held November 11, 2008. Post-hearing briefs are due February 2, 2009.

Lassen Dairy dba Meritage Dairy, 07-RC-4-VI

On September 4, 2007 UFCW International Union, Local 5 filed a representation petition with the Visalia Regional Office seeking to represent the agricultural employees of Lassen Dairy dba Meritage Dairy. The employer is a dairy located in Bakersfield with approximately 25 employees. An election was held on September 11, 2007 with the following results:

As the unresolved challenged ballots were outcome determinative, the Regional Director investigated the challenges and issued his report on challenged ballots on November 9, 2007. The Employer filed exceptions to that report on November 19, 2007. The Board issued its decision on challenged ballots on February 15, 2008. A hearing on the three (3) challenged ballots was held on March 18, 2008. On April 22, 2008 the Investigative Hearing Examiner (IHE) issued his decision in this matter. No exceptions were filed and the Executive Secretary issued his order making the IHE decision final on May 12, 2008. On May 13, 2008 the Regional Director opened and counted the three challenged ballots and issued an amended tally with the following results:

Since the two remaining challenged ballots are outcome determinative and are dependent on the processing of ULP charges involving the two affected workers, the Executive Secretary has requested that the investigation of charges pertaining to Juan Alberto Tostado and Jose Antonio Barbosa Tostado be expedited. On October 28, 2008 the Visalia Regional Director issued a complaint in this matter. A hearing on the related ulps is scheduled for March 24, 25 and 26, 2009.

L.E. Cooke Company, 08-RD-001-VIS

Agricultural employee Fabian Betanzos filed a decertification petition with the Visalia Regional Office seeking to decertify the incumbent representative, UFW, at L.E. Cooke Company. The employer is a bare tree nursery in Visalia with approximately 136 employees. An election was held on April 9, 2008 with the following results:

The number of unresolved challenged ballots is sufficient to affect the outcome of the election. On June 2, 2008, the Visalia Regional Director issued his report on challenged ballots in LE Cooke Company. Of the 12 challenges lodged, the Regional Director recommended that 9 challenges be overruled and the ballots opened and counted and that 3 ballots be held in abeyance to be set for hearing should the ballots be outcome determinative after a revised tally of ballots issues. No request for review was filed; therefore the ES issued an order making the report final on June 24, 2008 and directing the RD to issue an amended or final tally, as appropriate. On June 30, 2008, the Regional Director opened and counted nine (9) challenged ballots and issued a final tally:

The three remaining unresolved challenged ballots are insufficient to affect the outcome of the election. On November 13, 2008 the Executive Secretary issued his order on election objections setting one objection for hearing and dismissing the rest. The UFW filed its request for review November 24, 2008. On January 21, 2009 the Board issued its decision affirming the Executive Secretary's partial dismissal of objections. The investigative hearing is scheduled March 3, 2009. The employer has requested a continuance to March 17, 2009 that is under consideration.

Vista Vineyard Management, LLC, 2008-RD-001-SAL

Agricultural employee Cecilio Samario filed a decertification petition with the Visalia Regional Office on June 11, 2008 seeking to decertify the incumbent representative, UFW, at Vista Vineyard Management, LLC. The employer is a wine grape grower in St. Helena with approximately 65 employees. The election was held on June 18, 2008. The Regional Director impounded the ballots due to pending related unfair labor practice charges. On June 25, 2008, the UFW filed objections to the election. On July 1, 2008 the Acting Executive Secretary issued his order holding the election objections in abeyance pending investigation of six (6) related unfair labor practice charges. On January 16, 2009, the Regional Director issued a partial dismissal on one charge and a full dismissal of the remaining five (5) charges. The UFW's request for review is due February 9, 2009.

HerbThyme Farm, 2008-RC-006-VIS

On October 30, 2008 Laborers International Union of North America, Local 1184, filed a representation petition with the Visalia Regional Office seeking to represent the agricultural employees of Herb Thyme Farm. The employer is a grower of various

herbs (mint, oregano, cilantro...etc.) with approximately 90 employees. The pre-election conference was held on November 4, 2008. An election was held on November 6, 2008 in Thermal CA and yielded the following results:

On November 14, 2008 the Employer filed a single election objection concerning the appropriateness of the unit. The investigative hearing is scheduled February 9, 2009.

Valley View Farms, Case No. 2009-RD-001-VIS.

On January 6, 2009 agricultural employee Jose Sanchez filed a decertification petition with the Visalia Region Office seeking the ouster of the incumbent bargaining representative UFCW Local 5 at Valley View Farms. The employer is a dairy in Hanford, CA with 43 employees. An election was held on January 13, 2009 with the following results:

As the number of unresolved challenged ballots is insufficient to affect the outcome of the election, no challenged ballot investigation will be necessary. Election objections, if any, were due January 21, 2009. No objections were filed so the Executive Secretary issued Certification of Results of Election on January 22, 2009.

Frank Pinheiro Dairy & Milanese Farms, 2009-RC-001-VIS

On January 23, 2009 UFCW International Union, Local 5 filed a representation petition with the Visalia Regional Office seeking to represent the agricultural employees of Frank Pinheiro Dairy & Milanese Farms. The employer is a dairy located in Strathmore CA with 24 employees. An election was held January 30, 2009 with the following results:

As the number of unresolved challenged ballots is insufficient to affect the outcome of the election, no challenged ballot investigation is necessary. Election objections, if any, are due February 9, 2009.

Artesia Dairy, 06-RC-1-VI

On January, 25, 2008, the Employer filed a petition for writ of review with the 5th District Court of Appeal requesting that the court set aside the certification of election in Artesia Dairy. On November 20, 2008, the Fifth District Court of Appeal issued its decision in Artesia Dairy v. ALRB (Court of Appeal Case No. F054590). The court affirmed in part and reversed in part the Board's decision in Artesia Dairy, Case No. 33 ALRB No. 6. The Board had determined that three individuals who were the nephews and foster children of the owners of the dairy were the functional equivalent of the owners' children during the time in question and thus were ineligible to vote in a representation election under Board regulation section 20352. The Court reversed the Board's determination as to the owner's three nephews, finding that they were eligible voters because they did not fall within the plainly defined ineligible category of children of the employer set forth in section 20352(b)(5) of the Board's regulations. Therefore, the Court ordered that the ballots of the three nephews be opened and counted. The Court upheld the Board's determinations regarding four other individuals who were found to be ineligible to vote in the representation election.

On December 3, 2008, the Board filed a petition for rehearing with the 5th District Court of Appeal requesting that the Court affirm the Board's conclusion that the nephews/foster children were ineligible to vote. On December 16, 2008, the Court issued an order denying the Board's petition for rehearing. On January 20, 2009 the Court issued a remittitur returning jurisdiction over the matter to the Board

On January 27, 2009 the Board issued Administrative Order 2009-2 ordering that pursuant to the 5th District Court of Appeal's decision in Artesia Dairy v. Agricultural Labor Relations Board (2008) 168 Cal.App.4th 598, the ballots of Kevin John Avila II, Kasey John Avila, and Kannen John Avila be opened and counted. The matter is pending the opening and counting of the three ballots and the issuance of a final tally. The ballots are being opened and counted February 4, 2009 at 2:00 PM.

Vincent B. Zaninovich & Sons, Case No. F055640 (34 ALRB No. 3)

DeHaan v. ALRB, G578041 (Claim to the California Victim Compensation Board)

The California Victim Compensation Board denied the DeHaan claim on January 21, 2009.
